THIS MONTH IN THE REVOLUTION

The Battle of Yorktown ended on 19 Oct 1781, at Yorktown, VA. This was a decisive victory by a combined force of American Continental Army troops led by General George Washington, and French Army troops led by the Comte de Rochambeau over a British Army commanded by Lt. General Charles Cornwallis. This battle proved to be the last major land battle of the Revolutionary War, with the surrender and capture of Cornwallis and his army prompting the British government to negotiate an end to the conflict. With the combined armies surrounding the British fortifications and the British fleet, sent to provide assistance to Cornwallis, defeated by Comte de Grasse at the Battle of the Chesapeake, Cornwallis had nowhere to escape. Washington began a bombardment of the defenses on 14 Oct 1781. The French took redoubt #9 and the Americans, under Alexander Hamilton, took redoubt #10 and the British lines deteriorated quickly. Cornwallis called for capitulation on 17 Oct and surrender was given on 19 Oct, with Cornwallis absent. With the capture of 7000 British soldiers, negotiations began, and the Treaty of Paris was signed in 1783.

ONE OF OUR ES-TEEMED GUESTS AT OUR FALL MEETING WAS OUR NEW DISTRICT VP-GENERAL, MIKE ROWLEY. HE PARTICIPATED IN POSTING AND RETRIEVING THE COLORS WITH THE STATE COLOR GUARD. We had a great fall meeting at Mahoney State Park on 23 Sep 2018. One of our guests was our esteemed District Vice President General, Mike Rowley from Iowa. He participated in full uniform with the State Color Guard in presenting and retrieving the colors for the meeting.

The State Society was awarded numerous ribbons from National at the past Congress in Houston. We received a Certificate of Appreciation from the DAR for the help they received on the Indian Project in the Sandhill region of the state. We received the Eisenhower ribbon for our wreath laying in Abilene, KS during the grave marking, the Eagle Scout ribbon for our participation in the Eagle Scout program, and we received the Franklin Flyer streamer for our participation in the Friends of the Library program.

The Fire Safety Award was presented to Donald L Fritz from Norfolk for his long career in the Norfolk Fire Department and numerous fire safety councils.

A Meritorious Service medal was presented to Sen. LeRoy Louden for his service in representing the SAR at numerous DAR functions, as well as his work on the Indian Project in the Sandhills.

A new member of the NE SAR, Charles Tomlinson, was inducted into the Society.

Interim President, Shawn Stoner, was formally voted on and sworn in as our State President, and all officers went through their reports. The Board of Councilors will discuss procedures should another cancellation of a state meeting occur, so there is no confusion with the communications. President Stoner mentioned that 2020 will be the 130th Anniversary for the Nebraska Society and would like to plan a celebration meeting for our State Meeting on 26 Apr 2020, which is the exact date for 130 years. He would also like to form a grave marking committee to mark the graves of the first two Compatriots in the Society. 2026 will be the 250th Anniversary of the Declaration of Independence, and he would like to form a small committee to look into what can be done for that celebration.

An application committee has been formed, with John Reinert as chairman, to discuss and streamline the application process between chapters and the state. Contact him if you would like to volunteer. Overall, a very busy meeting with a lot of discussions! Have you thought about when you joined the Omaha Chapter, were excited about what you accomplished for entry, but possibly didn't know many, or any, of the other members, so you felt uncomfortable and didn't enjoy Chapter meetings or events? We are trying to change that by instituting a Mentoring Program for new members. We are issuing a call for volunteers to be


