THIS MONTH IN THE REVOLUTION



Paul Revere

On 5 Mar 1770, the Boston Massacre occurred. An altercation between British soldiers and a crowd of angry, drunk colonists occurred. The colonists were throwing snowballs and yelling at the soldiers and they eventually began to throw clubs and other heavy objects, all while taunting the soldiers to "fire".



A soldier was hit in the head with a club and his musket discharged as he fell. The other soldiers, thinking there was a command to fire, opened up on the crowd. Three men were killed and 8 others wounded, with two of them later dying from their injuries. The soldiers were taken to court in Boston where they had John Adams as their council. The soldiers were found innocent, taken to England, where they were found guilty and punished.

Paul Revere made an etching of the scene which included this prose: "Unhappy Boston! See thy sons deplore, Thy Hallow'd Walks, besmear'd with guiltless Gore: While faithless

P&mdash—n and his savage Bands, With murd'rous Rancour stretch their bloody Hands; Like fierce Barbarians grinning o'er their Prey, Approve the Carnage, and enjoy the Day."

The etching and Prose was titled, "The Fruits of Arbitrary Power, or the Bloody Massacre". The etching was used as propaganda by the colonists to give the Patriots one more thing to blame on the King. Based on the evidence that John Adams brought, the etching was inaccurate, but the seeds of discourse were beginning to be sown.

AMERICANISM REPORT DETAILS



Our Chapter's performance is evaluated at the National level through the Americanism Report.

The Americanism Report is two reports combined, that Chapters submit to the Nebraska SAR and to National SAR. Chapters report their various activities and participation in events during the year which is used by the NESSAR to compile the State Report, and National uses these reports to evaluate Chapter and State Society performance throughout the year and select Chapters and State Societies for awards and recognition, based on their results. We will focus on the 1st part, the Americanism Award Report, in this issue and the 2nd part, the President General's Activities Award Report, in the April newsletter.

Part 1 of the report, the Americanism Award Report, lists activities external of the Chapter and State Society in support of SAR goals and objectives. Category 1 - Publicity in both print and electronic (web-based newspapers/ letters/blogs, etc.) media of chapter or member activities

cast media (TV and radio)

Category 3 - Speakers Bureau (talks on patriotic, historical, or educational topics to organizations/groups, schools, or SAR, DAR, or CAR events/ meetings)

Category 4 - Multimedia distribution (dissemination/donation of NSSAR produced, free CD's to schools and educational organizations)

<u>Category 6</u> - Youth Programs (recognition of and awards to oration, essay, poster, and brochure contest participants, JROTC students, Eagle Scouts, and history teachers)

Category 7 - Public Service Programs (recognition of fire safety, law enforcement, and EMS personnel; Chapter members on a school board; Rev War displays in libraries, museums, or schools; sponsoring a public service event with an SAR theme; participation in public parades; and presenting a framed copy of a historic document to a school, library, museum, or other public building)

Category 8 - Granting of scholarships the Americanism Award Report for and monetary awards to youth contest winners

Category 9 - Veterans support (points come from the Chapter's Stark Report on veteran's support and activities) Category 10 - Special Observances/ Ceremonies (sponsoring or attending historic events such as Washington's Bday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Yorktown Day, Veteran's Day, Wreaths Across America, and many other historic events held locally and across the state and nation)

Category 11 - Patriot and Compatriot Grave Markings and Patriot Biographies

Category 2 - Publicity through broad- Category 12A - SAR Awards to Non-SAR members (recognizing support to the community or the SAR other than youth and public service awards from other categories)

For many of these categories, when any of us participates while we are in Revolutionary War uniforms or period clothing, we receive bonus points in that category. So we ask you to consider becoming part of the Color Guard and utilizing a loaner uniform for any of the categories, meetings, or events that we host, support, and/or participate in. Please think about how you can participate and help us gain more points for 2019. Even if it is just attending the State Meeting, if we all contribute just a little bit towards our meetings, activities, and events, the dividends will pay off in the long term. If you participate in any form, at any activity that we may not know about, please be sure to let Secretary Paul Burright about i t know pburright72@gmail.com, so that it can be added to the Chapter Report. To give you all some perspective, we scored 915 points, as a Chapter, on 2018. We rate our scores against other Chapters with comparable membership numbers. As this is the first year we have submitted, it gives us a baseline and goal to beat in 2019. Please consider how you can participate and help improve our
